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Spring Cleaning Your Garden

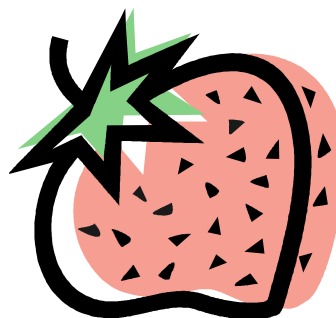
We are all anxious to get into our gardens on the first warm day of spring. Be careful about walking on soil that is too wet as this causes soil compaction.

If you didn't remove your fall bearing bramble canes last fall, late winter/early spring is the time to do so.

This is also a good time to remove any winter damaged, weak or spindly canes and to thin the rows to approximately 5 good canes per linear foot of row.

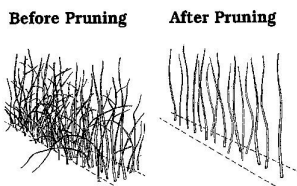
Leave the straw on your strawberries!

Every year eager gardeners want to know when to remove the straw from their strawberry plants. And we always tell them to wait. Let the strawberry plant dictate when it's time. If you see the leaves turning yellow, then it's time. Just pull the straw back enough to let the leaves poke through. Try to leave as much of the ground covered as possible. This creates a barrier between the soil and the fruit and makes for cleaner and more disease free fruit.



DON'T FERTILIZE YOUR STRAWBERRIES IN THE SPRING!!!

You may think you are giving your strawberries a boost by applying fertilizer in the spring. What you are doing is creating soft, mushy fruit. Wait and fertilize after harvest at renovation.
